## Community Campus Code of Conduct

Community Campuses are public buildings which are a focus for civic and community life as well as educational establishments. This Code of Conduct is necessary to ensure a shared understanding of the required conduct of all who use the campus facilities. Observance of this will not only ensure the overall safety and wellbeing of all users and service providers, but will also enhance everyone's experience of the campus.

Campus users are asked to:

- park only in designated areas and display an appropriate permit if parking in a disabled parking space;
- enter premises through the main public access doors or designated entry/exit doors only;
- refrain from coming to the campus while under the influence of alcohol, drugs or other illegal substances;
- avoid entering any area designated for staff or private use;
- ensure that children aged eight years or under are supervised at all times by a responsible adult;
- follow any specific instructions from Campus Staff in the event of an emergency;
- note that Assistance Dogs are the only animals permitted in campus buildings;
- keep noise to a reasonable level;
- act in a respectful and appropriate way to members of staff and other users;
- wear appropriate attire at all times when using the sports facilities;
- refrain from using offensive or abusive language;
- allow others to use the facilities free from any obstruction or annoyance;
- treat all campus property and facilities with respect;
- obtain the permission of Campus Management before borrowing or removing any items from the premises;
- refrain from smoking within the campus buildings and the immediate vicinity;
- eat and drink only within designated areas;
- eat and drink only items purchased on site, unless by prior arrangement with Campus Management;
- use the litter bins provided;
- refrain from using the facilities for any unlawful purpose, including bringing any illegal substances onto the campus;
- use bicycles only for legitimate access to campus grounds;
- refrain from rollerblading, skateboarding, roller-skating or using scooters in campus buildings;
- use video, radio, photography or sound recording equipment only with the permission of Campus Management;
- obtain the permission of Campus Management to leave or display brochures, leaflets, posters or other promotional material;
- note that Campus Management reserve the right to restrict admission.
