## Placecheck Update Exhibition

52 adults and 19 children came to the drop in session on Wednesday 22 April 2009 between 2.30pm to 6.30pm at Dunning Village Hall to look at an exhibition on progress made so far on designs for the priority issues that were identified at previous Placecheck events.



Residents were able to look at the designs options for improvements proposed, ask questions and make suggestions to the various council officers present. Residents also enjoyed a walk around Dunning with the Dunning Parish Historical Society to know Dunning better.

A DVD was also shown during the afternoon showing the previous two Placecheck events in Dunning and this was especially enjoyed by those 'starring' in the DVD!

## Rollo Park Pavilion

Fundraising towards the new pavilion in Rollo Park is ongoing. A proportion of the funding has already been secured and applications for the remainder have been submitted to Sport Scotland, Scottish Rural Development Programme and The Robertson Trust.

The Rollo Park Community Pavilion will provide a fit for purpose, modern pavilion for Dunning Golf Club, Dunning Tennis Club and the local community.

One of the main objectives of the new community pavilion is to encourage participation in golf and tennis amongst members of the local community in Dunning. In addition to golf and tennis however, the pavilion will include a public toilet, disabled toilet, ladies, gents and junior changing facilities and have facilities for community groups to use for meetings and events.

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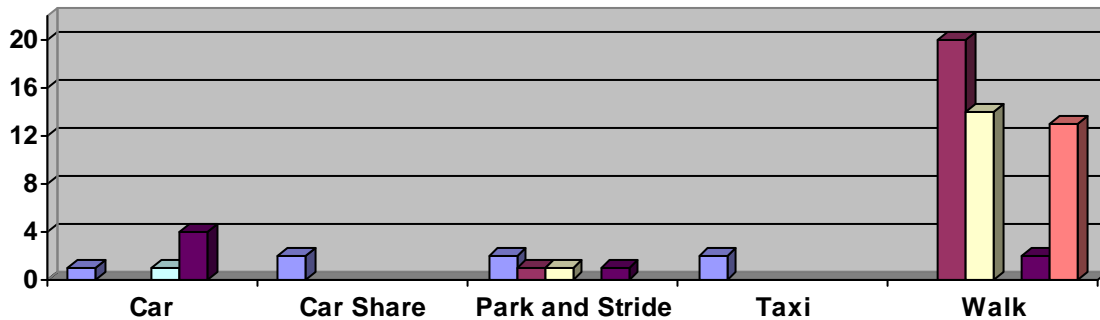
**Workshop at Dunning Primary School**

On Monday 30th March all the children from Dunning Primary School took part in a workshop organised by The Environment Service. The headteacher, kindly organised for the classes to come to the workshop one at a time to take part in two activities.

Before the workshop, Sue Allen, a Landscape Architect had sent a questionnaire home with the children where they chose their favourite types of play equipment. From this, Sue researched various types of swings, flying foxes, climbing frames and other equipment and at the workshop they children had to vote for their favourites. It is hoped that the new play equipment will be installed by the end of this year, other plans for the park include an small orchard planted by the children and a seat designed and to be built by young people from the youth club.

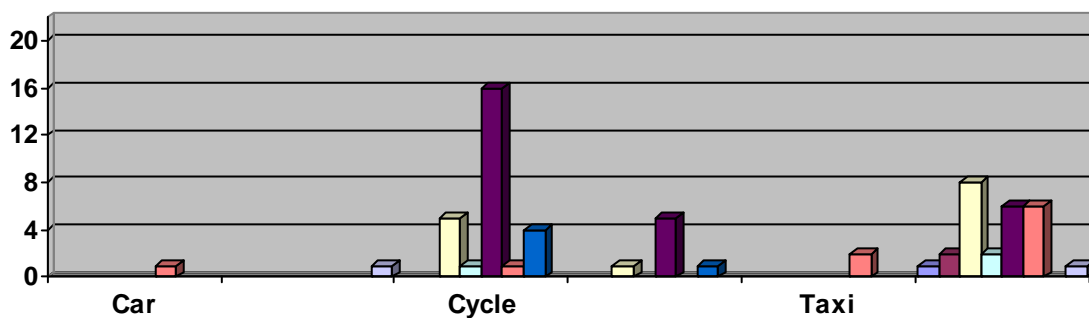
The other part of the workshop was about the children's routes to school. As part of the School Travel Plan Process Donna Cromb and Persephone Beer asked the children to show them on a map where they travelled from each day and then indicate how they travelled. The charts below show the results of the current and desired travel mode by pupils. The Survey established a high level of desire from pupils to cycle to/from school. As a result of this survey, cycle parking is to be installed for next term.
