
Strathearn Community Campus offers a wide range of facilities for all members of the local community as well as being the home of Crieff High School.

Since its opening in November, 2009, Strathearn Community Campus has provided state of the art facilities for sport and recreation which include a range of activities from Live Active Leisure. Strathearn Community Library is also situated on the site. Full catering facilities for a wide range of events are provided by Tayside Contracts. Youth work and adult learning services and community workers are based here. The building and outdoor areas are available for use by the community both during and outside of school hours. These include specialist areas, for example, art rooms, drama studio, recording studio, theatre and ICT suites.

Libraries and Lifelong Learning

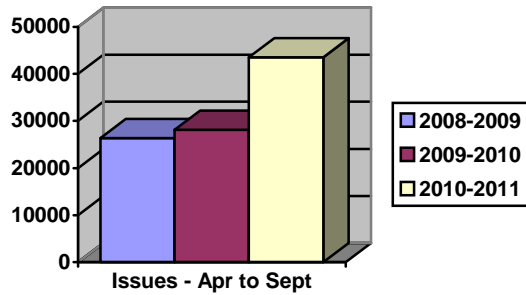
The range of facilities provided in Strathearn Community Library has been enhanced following consultation with the local community. There is now a greater choice of books, DVDs and CDs on the shelves for library members to borrow, and issues have risen by 40% since the community campus library opened as shown in the graph below. The library opening hours have also increased from 40 to 51 per week and the number of people visiting the library has also increased by approximately 30%. ICT resources have also been increased; there are now 15 PCs and 6 laptops, all with internet access, available for use in the community campus library. Additional assistive and adaptive technology, such as screen reading software is available.

Elderly residents in Crieff are transported to the library in the community bus, driven by local volunteers from the Strathcare Association, allowing the residents to choose their own books, have a coffee and a chat before being driven home again.

There are a number of active Reading Groups in the Crieff area, including 2 groups which meet in the library, which are supported through collections of resources, innovative reader development programmes and a varied programme of author visits which have been well attended this year. The past 12 months has seen several author visits taking place for both the community and for school pupils.

Strathearn Community Library continues to work in partnership with local people in order to provide services tailored to the needs of their community, which this has helped to forge strong relationships with groups and individuals and will assist in further building the role of the library and the campus within the local community.

Cultural and Community Services

13 Cultural and Community Services staff (other than Libraries, separately reported) are permanently located on campus. They include Community Learning and Development Workers, Active Schools staff, Community Link Workers. Together, they have worked jointly and in collaboration with Crieff High School staff, community organisations and other agencies to deliver a range of learning opportunities for pupils, families and the wider community. Other staff not located on campus (e.g. Arts Development) have also played a key part in this process.

- 1600 people participated in the Campus Opening events arranged for the Community in December 2009
- 500 people attended the Campus Open Morning in October 2010
- From April 1 2010 to present, 700 people have attended scheduled community learning activities or classes, including ESOL, Literacies, ICT, Groupwork, Healthy Lifestyles or support to community groups.
- From April 1 2010 to present, 2947 people have attended meetings, drop-ins, youth information sessions and other events arranged by Cultural and Communities staff
- Over 100 local young people aged 12-18 have achieved Youth Achievement, Dynamic Youth, Duke of Edinburgh or Millennium Volunteer Awards through work between Youth Workers, School and Logos Youth Project
- 80 individuals attended the successful 'Getting Older, Thinking Younger' event in April 2010 targeted on the older age groups
- 25 volunteer sports coaches have been trained through the Active Schools programme and there are 13 extra curricular sports clubs at Crieff High School
- 69 Learners have gained basic ICT skills through adult learning sessions

Catering Support Team/Tayside Contracts

The Health & Wellbeing of pupils can be improved by participating in school food service provision as the food and drink provided meets the criteria laid down by the Scottish Government for food, drink and nutrition standards. Service outlets for pupils increased from 2 to 6 to include 2 main food service counters, a snack food kiosk, a mobile servery, a variety of vending and an electronic pre-order station. Our new operation has made the dining area a real destination point. Consultation with pupils has resulted in very positive feedback and already an additional salad bar counter has been deployed as part of ongoing development. Extensive retail and hospitality catering services have been made available to both the school and wider community to support the aims of the campus facilities. A retail food kiosk and extensive vending (already added to since the opening) provide refreshment services throughout the campus opening hours. User groups include a variety of sporting groups, OAP's, corporate users, drama and dance groups, pipe bands, parent groups, teachers and individuals. Catering from 5 to 500 for meetings, ceilidhs, barbeques and open day events has made for a diverse service provision. Many activities have also taken place during the school day showing the real community accessibility of the campus.

Strathearn Community Campus has been serving well in excess of 400 pupils daily. This has been a relatively consistent figure since opening week and represents a 100% increase when compared to the uptake in the old school.

The team at Strathearn have catered for 198 functions since the Campus opened, ranging from the teas and coffees to larger events.

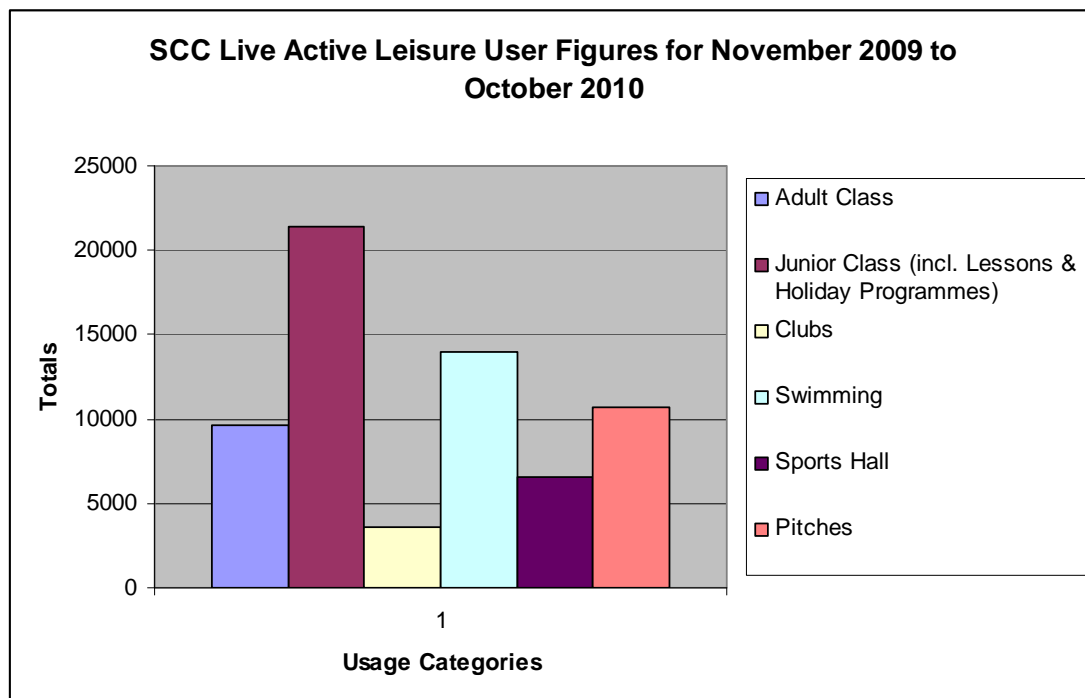
