

What are the charges?

The cost of care packages provided will be based on the following charges:

Home Care hours	£10.40 per hour
Community Alarm	£3.47 per week
Sheltered Housing Support	£6.30 - £21.00 per week

What if I disagree with the financial assessment?

Please contact the Charging Team (see back page) and ask for a 'Review'.

What if I do not want to provide my financial details?

If you choose not to provide your financial details, a financial assessment cannot be completed and you will be charged the full cost of any chargeable Care at Home Services.

How do I pay?

A choice of payment methods are detailed on the reverse side of all invoices.

What if I move home or my circumstances change?

If you move home, or your financial circumstances change you must let us know as soon as possible, as this may affect your charges. In these circumstances, please contact a member of the Welfare Rights Team.

Charges

Effective from Monday 11 April 2011

Perth & Kinross Council wishes to help people to live at home independently, safely and for as long as possible.

However, in order to provide affordable, high quality services to a wide range of clients, a Care at Home charging policy is in place.

Are all services charged for?

Perth & Kinross Council will offer, free of charge, the following services to people, providing they have been assessed as requiring them:

Aged Over 65

Occupational Therapy Equipment*
Daycare Services*
Transport to Day Centres* or Adult Resource Centres
Personal Care

Aged Under 65

Occupational Therapy Equipment*
Daycare Services

* will be chargeable from 1 October 2011

What services are charged for?

Perth & Kinross Council continue to charge towards the cost of certain tasks. These are:

Aged Over 65

Non Personal Care - housework, shopping etc
Community Alarm
Sheltered Housing Support

Aged Under 65

Non Personal Care - housework, shopping etc
Personal Care
Community Alarm
Sheltered Housing Support
Transport to Day Centres or Adult Resource Centres

How is my personal contribution calculated?

A financial assessment is carried out to determine how much, if anything, you will contribute towards the cost of chargeable Care at Home Services. This assessment takes account of your income and capital, and then calculates your contribution. If your weekly income, after allowing for housing and Council Tax costs, is less than £161.00, you will not be asked to contribute towards the costs of Care at Home Services.

The amount of weekly income over £161.00 is called your 'weekly chargeable income'. You will be asked to contribute your 'weekly chargeable income', or the cost of your services received, whichever is the lower amount.

There is a minimum weekly charge of £1.00. If your 'weekly chargeable income' is less than £1.00, you will not be asked to contribute towards the costs of Care at Home Services.

How do I know if I am receiving all the correct state benefits?

The financial assessment allows Perth & Kinross Council to offer you our 'Income Maximisation Service'. This ensures that you are in receipt of all the benefits you are entitled to. Assistance will be provided to make claims for any new benefits.

Will my savings/capital affect the charge?

If you have capital over £10,000, this will be assessed as having additional income. This is called 'Tariff Income' and the levels are set at £1 for every £500 above £10,000.



Examples of Tariff Income levels:

Capital	£12,500	£15,000	£17,500	£20,000
Weekly Tariff Income	£5.00	£10.00	£15.00	£20.00

Clients with capital over £23,500 will be charged the full cost of any chargeable Care at Home Services.

The capital value of the property you live in is completely disregarded.
