Minute of Special Meeting of the Licensing Committee held in the Council Chambers, Council Building, 2 High Street, Perth on Thursday 13 May 2010 at 1.00pm.

280. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no Declarations of Interest made in terms of the Councillors' Code of Conduct.

281. NOTIFICATION OF PUBLIC PROCESSION – 26 JUNE 2010

There was submitted a report by the Head of Democratic Services (10/250), together with (1) revised Notification of Proposed Public Processions; and (2) letter of observation dated 10 May 2010 from the Chief Constable, Tayside Police, giving notification of a parade involving some 4,000 participants to take place in Perth on 26 June 2010 and setting out the options open to the Committee in determining the Notification.

The applicants, represented by Messrs J G MacLean and D Walters, addressed the Committee and answered Members' questions. The representatives of the Chief Constable and officers from Perth and Kinross Council also answered Members' questions.

FOLLOWING A SHORT ADJOURNMENT, THE COMMITTEE RECONVENED.

Motion (Councillors P Mulheron and B Ellis)

The notification of public procession on 26 June 2010, in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, Part V – Public Processions and the Police, Public Order and Criminal Justice (Scotland) Act 2006, Part II – Public Order, be approved and Option 2 of Report 10/250 be implemented, as follows with Condition 6 being amended to read as undernoted:

- (1) The procession must commence at 12.00hrs as stated in the Order.**
- (2) The procession must keep to the route stated in the Order.**
- (3) The Police will give instructions about the width of the carriageway which may be utilised by the participants. These instructions will vary**

in accordance with the particular type of carriageway, and these instructions must be obeyed.

- (4) Organisers and participants shall comply at all times with the directions or instructions given to them by the Police.
- (5) Where there are no footpaths, participants should keep to the left hand side of the road.
- (6) Any litter deposited by the participants must be removed from the marshalling up area by 6.00pm that day.
- (7) Members of the procession shall congregate between 09.00hrs and 12.00hrs; the procession shall set off at 12.00hrs.
- (8) There shall be no playing of musical instruments after the arrival of the procession at the South Inch car park.
- (9) The names and addresses of marshals for the procession must be notified to the Police 48 hours before the procession. In the event of any changes occurring in marshals, names and addresses of replacement marshals shall be supplied to the Senior Police Officer present prior to leaving the marshalling area.
- (10) Levels of marshalling for the procession must be agreed by the Police and the Organiser.
- (11) Any participants deemed to be under the influence of alcohol by the Police must be prohibited from taking part in the procession.
- (12) No alcohol will be consumed by any member of the procession at the assembly point.
- (13) Following the conclusion of the platform proceedings, participants must immediately vacate the area, and disperse to waiting transport.

Amendment (Councillors H Stewart and D Melloy)

The notification of public procession on 26 June 2010, in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, Part V – Public Processions and the Police, Public Order and Criminal Justice (Scotland) Act 2006, Part II – Public Order, be not approved in the interests of public safety and Option 3 of Report 10/250 be implemented as follows:

Reject the Notification and make an Order prohibiting the holding of the procession.

282. PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE – T IN THE PARK MUSIC EVENT, BALADO AIRFIELD, KINROSS – 8-12 JULY 2010

There was submitted a report by the Chief Executive (10/251), (1) setting out the Licensing Conditions for T In The Park, to be held at Balado Airfield, Kinross in July 2010; and (2) presenting the conditions in a general framework format supported by a network of management plans.

- (iv) The finalisation of any necessary adjustments to the Conditions to attach to the Licence for the 2010 event, be delegated to the Chief Executive of the Council, in consultation with the Convener of the Licensing Committee.
