Background

Curriculum for Excellence (Scottish Executive, 2004) reflects the values, purposes and principles of Scottish education for the 21st Century. Perth & Kinross Council's Education & Children's Services have a clear three year implementation strategy for creating a Curriculum for Excellence (May 2008).

The curriculum must provide learning opportunities that meet the needs of all children and young people in a planned and coherent way, within the context of the Perth & Kinross Council Education & Children's Services - Policy Framework, namely:

- ❑ *Learning: Realising Potential*
- ❑ *Learning: Developing Communities*
- ❑ *Inclusion and Equality*

Curriculum for Excellence endorses our view that all of our children and young people can succeed and that all partners in the learning process - pupils, parents and teachers - must continually search for ways to encourage, motivate and involve each learner in Perth and Kinross.

Journey to Excellence (Scottish Executive, 2006) "*brings together the principles of self-evaluation, school development planning, measuring and managing performance and school effectiveness and improvement*" (The Journey to Excellence, Part 1, Scottish Executive, 2006). It also provides a coherent model for ambitious and excellent schools with practical support to enable schools and staff to make the journey to excellence. Journey to Excellence is also being developed for a community learning and development setting.

There are five parts to a Journey to Excellence:

- Part 1** *Aiming for Excellence*
- Part 2** *Exploring Excellence*
- Part 3** *How Good Are We Now?*
- Part 4** *Planning for Excellence*
- Part 5** *Journey to Excellence*

This strategy focuses on Journey to Excellence Part 5 which:

- ❑ *provides real examples of excellent practice in early education centres and school communities, in audio-visual format;*
- ❑ *presents the voices of children, young people, staff, parents and partners describing the stage their school has reached on the Journey to Excellence, the route it has taken and where they are going next.*

As part of a national trial, initiated by HMIE, Perth & Kinross Council's Education & Children's Services is one of four Local Authorities who were asked to plan a Roll Out Strategy for Part 5 Journey to Excellence across the Authority. The **aims** of this trial, linked to creating a Curriculum for Excellence in Perth and Kinross, are to:

- ❑ *raise awareness of Journey to Excellence Part 5 with all staff;*
- ❑ *embed the resource into practice.*

This paper explores how the Authority will roll out Journey to Excellence Part 5 2008-2010.

- ❑ *Perth & Kinross Council Website and Wiki Space*
- ❑ *Parent Councils*

Taken together, these will provide a menu of ways to enable all early years' establishments and school communities to make full and effective use of this resource in maximizing their journey to excellence and embedding effective learning and teaching approaches into practice.
