Introduction

This leaflet has been produced to give an insight into the benefits of independent travel support and training for individuals with learning disabilities and their parents and carers.

If you feel that you have the ability and desire to travel independently to access a day opportunity or workplace, then support can be provided to help you reach your goal.

- Promotes independent access to employment, day opportunities and community facilities.
- Raises self-confidence and increases independence and use of own initiative.

Support for Individuals Accessing Independent Travel Training

Our team's remit is to support and give appropriate support at a level and pace appropriate to the individual. The people we support will already have a variety of skills and experience relating to travel; we aim to enhance these skills and to support individuals reach their potential. In the first instance we will meet with the individual/carer/parent to discuss what their independent travel goals are. We will provide 1:1 support and assist individuals to travel to day opportunities, community activities or work.

STOP

We will support people to access and establish safe routes and help develop and improve individual's road safety skills. We will work alongside people on a one-to-one basis until such times as they are assessed as being able to undertake a journey independently. Only then will we reduce our support but we will continue to monitor as necessary.



We will support individuals with their road safety skills and assess this throughout.

Road safety tools, eg 'Road Safety Step by Step' and 'A2B Safely', will be used to help promote independent travel.

Working in partnership with Police Scotland Tayside Division's Road Safety Officer.

Assessment Tools

Continual assessment and progress will be recorded using Independent Travel Competency Matrix.

This consists of four units:

- 1. Awareness for Pedestrians
- 2. Safe Travel
- 3. Travel Independently
- 4. Trains (if required)

All of the above units are progressed at the level and pace appropriate to the individual.



We will put in place risk assessments for each individual who is accessing the independent travel training.

We will carry these out prior to any person starting independent travel training.

Frequently Asked Questions

What happens if I do not manage to independently travel?

Should you choose not to continue or you are assessed as not being able to independently travel, we will support you to look at other suitable options of travel, alternatively you will revert back to your previous travel arrangements. If you think you can do independent travel - why not give it a go?

How long does the training take?

Everyone will be assessed on an individual basis but we would offer individuals up to 3 months support to access independent travel training.

What support can I expect?

- Practical advice on independent travel training
- One-to-one support to enable you to travel independently
- Ongoing assessment
- Pictorial safe route
- Risk assessments
- Step-by-step road safety
- Safe route planning
- Regular review and feedback
- Emergency strategies
- Access to public transport
