

Park and Stride

The provision of alternatives to school travel by car will be investigated by the Travel Plan Steering Group.

Parents

Parents (other than those of nursery pupils who have an exceptional need) are encouraged not to use a car to drop off pupils in the immediate vicinity of the campus, because of the congestion and road safety risks that will be created if they enter the campus premises or adjoining roads.

Nursery Car Parking

The Nursery opening times are 9.00 am to 11.30 am and 12.45 pm to 3.15 pm. Ten car parking spaces opposite the Nursery entrance will be reserved for Nursery parking only at the following times: 8.45 am to 9.15 am, 11.15 am to 11.45 am, 12.30 pm to 1.00 pm and 3.00 pm to 3.30 pm.

Campus Travel Plan

The Campus Travel Plan is a document that identifies local issues relating to the journey to and from the campus, with the aim of delivering benefits for safety, health and the environment. It identifies a package of measures designed to promote more sustainable travel choices for pupils, parents, staff and visitors to the campus. Transport and Travel Information


All the transport and travel measures are planned to support safe, healthy and sustainable travel to school and are set within a context of parents and carers having the ultimate responsibility for ensuring the safe travel of their child(ren) to and from school.

School Crossing Patroller (SCP)



To assist with safer travel to school, a School Crossing Patroller will be located at the signalised junction at Crieff Road/Taybridge Road at school opening and closing times from 8.30 am to 9.05 am and 3.25 pm to 4.00 pm.

This location will be monitored and reviewed if required. Other potential areas for School Crossing Patrollers will be monitored once travel patterns to the campus are established. The campus has a dedicated Travel Plan Steering Group who will be directly involved in this.

Speed Limit

There is a part time, mandatory 20mph School Zone with flashing beacons on Crieff Road, which operates during school opening and closing times.

Alma Avenue is covered by an advisory Twenty's Plenty limit.

School Transport

School transport arrangements will not change significantly following the move to the campus. Travel information issued at the start of the 2010/2011 session to the parents of pupils entitled to free home to school transport is still valid.

Free school transport is normally only provided to primary school pupils who live more than two miles and to secondary school pupils who live more than three miles from their catchment school, measured by the shortest available walking route. Transport is not provided for nursery pupils.

The new alighting and boarding arrangements for school transport vehicles on the campus will be closely supervised by school staff.

Campus Access by Public Transport

From within Aberfeldy:

Stagecoach Perth Service 23

Monday to Saturday - provides an hourly service from Chapel Street to Kenmore Street, Taybridge Drive and Taybridge Terrace.

Stagecoach Perth Service 83

Sundays - provides four journeys along the route of the Perth Service 23.

Caber Coaches Service 91

Monday, Thursday and Friday - provides five day-time journeys, linking the Moness Crescent and Alma Avenue areas with the town centre, that will go to the campus itself.

Stagecoach Perth Services provide regular (hourly Monday to Saturday) services to settlements east of Aberfeldy including Grandtully, Ballinluig, Pitlochry (by change at Ballinluig), Dunkeld, Bankfoot and Perth. There are also services that run to settlements west of Aberfeldy.
