

Keeping Vehicle Speed Down

- Gowans Terrace lies within a permanent, mandatory 20mph speed limit zone.
- In addition, there is a series of traffic calming and speed reduction measures throughout the Muirton Park area including speed humps, speed tables, traffic priority systems and pavement build outs.

Dropping Children Off

- Given the very young age of nursery pupils, parking spaces will be made available for nursery parents only to drop off and pick up their children.
- In the interests of pupil safety, parents (other than those of nursery pupils, who have an exceptional need) are strongly encouraged not to use a car to drop off children in the immediate vicinity of the campus. This will cause congestion and road safety risks. Please see Park and Stride inside and the Park and Stride leaflet for safer alternatives.

Transport and Travel Information

All transport and travel measures are planned to support safe, healthy and sustainable travel to school and are set within a context of parents and carers having the ultimate responsibility for ensuring the safe travel of their child(ren) to and from school.

Perth & Kinross Council is committed to working with you to ensure safer travel of school pupils and campus users to and from the North Inch Community Campus. The campus travel plan sets out measures that are designed to support this. The plan is reviewed and updated as required by the Travel Plan Steering Group, which includes representatives from St John's Academy and the Council.

The school is very keen to reduce car travel and to promote safe and healthy journeys to school, although the decision on whether a child is ready to make the journey to school independently must rest with parents/carers and the children themselves. As many children as possible are encouraged to walk or cycle to school, particularly where journeys are less than a mile for younger children and less than two miles for older children.

Walking and cycling boosts children's health and wellbeing. It allows them to travel independently and to access a range of flexible opportunities the campus offers outside the standard school day. Freedom to move around the local area independently is an important part of growing up. To help ensure safer travel for everyone, please play your part in complying with and using the measures set out.

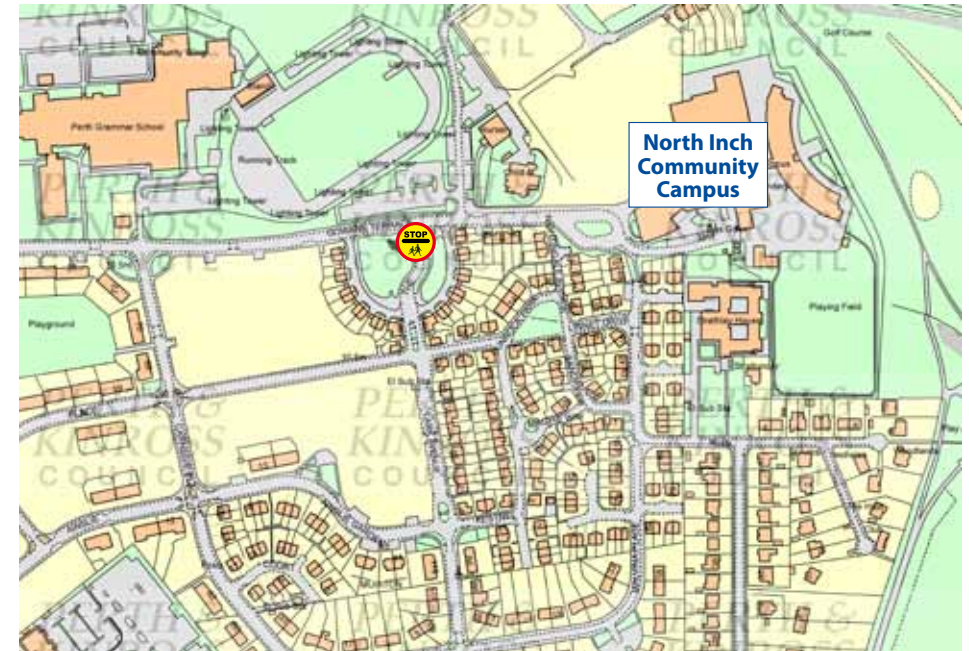
Park and Stride

- *Park and Stride is being suggested to alleviate vehicle congestion on the roads around the campus, to improve road safety and to allow children an opportunity to develop road skills.*
- *Further information and details of suggested car parking and walking routes can be found in the North Inch Community Campus Park and Stride leaflet.*

Crossing Safely



- *A School Crossing Patroller will operate on Gowans Terrace, in the vicinity of the junction with The Rookery.*
- *Travel patterns will continue to be monitored and facilities reviewed where required through the Travel Plan Steering Group.*



School and Public Transport

- *Free school transport is normally only provided to primary school pupils who live more than two miles away and secondary school pupils who live more than three miles away from their catchment school, measured by the shortest available walking route. Transport is not provided for nursery pupils.*
- *School staff closely supervise pupils when they are alighting from and boarding school transport vehicles on the campus.*
- *Six bus services pass nearby to the campus (Stagecoach Perth routes 5, 6, 8, 9, 10 and 70), serving The Rookery which is approximately five minutes walk from the campus. These buses serve the North Muirton area and Perth City Centre and between them run almost every five minutes.*
