Application procedures

We can help with applying through UCAS for a university place. We can also arrange campus tours for young people and their carers, to enable them to get a better idea of what the University offers. Our 'Step Up to University' module prepares students for coming to university by helping with learning and study skills, while our free summer school will give a taste of the subjects that will be studied.

Funding advice

Advice on student support and relevant funding is offered, as well as guidance on managing this income.

Accommodation

We can arrange year round University accommodation for Care Leavers in our University residences.

Support at University

All new students are offered a Buddy - someone who has studied the same subject to help you cope with everything from finding your way around campus, to getting advice from your lecturers, to where the best place is to eat. We can also offer support through our Student Counsellors, advice from our Enabling Support services for students with a disability and help with part-time employment opportunities, work placements and careers advice from our Employability Link Team.
