## APPLICATIONS FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

## **Report by Depute Director (Environment)**

#### PURPOSE OF REPORT

The report asks Auchterarder Common Good Fund Committee to consider applications for financial assistance.

## 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Perth and Kinross Council owns land and property which forms part of the common good of the former burghs in Perth & Kinross and has a statutory duty in terms of section 15 of the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994 to administer this land and property "having regard to the interests of the inhabitants" of those former burghs. This duty also applies to the administration of the associated common good funds.
- 1.2 The Common Good Funds have traditionally demonstrated their support to local residents and organisations by distributing grant. These grant awards are to individuals and local organisations to carry out a wide range of community based activities.

#### 2. PROPOSALS

#### **Community School of Auchterarder**

2.1 An application has been received from the Community School of Auchterarder seeking a grant towards the cost of the Annual School Prize Award Ceremony. The total costs amounts to £1,900. The applicant is requesting £800. The school benefitted from the Fund in 2010/11 (£700), 2012/13 (£700) and in 2013/14 (£700). It is recommended that Auchterarder Common Good Fund Committee award a grant of £800 in line with the guidance (see Appendix 1 – Criteria 7). The grant will contribute to social inclusion.

#### Recommendation

2.2 The Community School of Auchterarder be awarded a grant of £800 towards the Annual School Prize Award Ceremony.

#### **Community School of Auchterarder**

2.3 An application has been received from the Community School of Auchterarder seeking a grant towards the cost of taking 7 pupils to Malawi in June 2014. The total costs which includes travel and vaccinations amounts to £6,200. The school is requesting £2,500. The school benefitted from this Fund in 2013/14 (£1,000) for similar trip.

2.4 It is recommended that Auchterarder Common Good Fund Committee award a grant of £600 in line with the guidance (see Appendix 1 – Criteria 11). The grant will contribute to social inclusion.

## Recommendation

2.5 The Community School of Auchterarder be awarded a grant of £600 towards the trip to Malawi.

## **Community School of Auchterarder Pipe Band**

2.6 An application has been received from the Community School of Auchterarder Pipe Band seeking a grant towards the cost of purchasing 32 uniforms to enable them to be presentable at events. The total cost of 32 uniforms amounts to £9,600. The Band is requesting £1,000. The Pipe Band have never benefitted from this fund. It is recommended to award a grant of £1,000 in line with the guidance (see Appendix 1 – Criteria 4) subject to the uniforms being retained by the Band. The grant will contribute to social inclusion.

#### Recommendation

2.7 The Community School of Auchterarder Pipe Band be awarded a grant of £1,000 towards purchasing 32 uniforms to be retained by the Band.

## Auchterarder Golf Club

2.7 An application has been received from the Auchterarder Golf Club seeking a grant towards the costs of golf course Improvements. The total costs amount to £80,500 including drainage on greens, holes and fairways (£24,000), tee reconstruction (£16,500), on-course toilets (£31,000) and construction of buggy park (£9,000). The club have never benefitted from this Fund. The organisation has applied for £40,000. The grounds are owned by Auchterarder Common Good Fund although the facilities (eg clubhouse) are owned by the golf club. The Club pays an annual rental of £18,000. The golf club is a non-profit making body dedicated to the supply of sporting activities and membership is open to all with opportunities for visitors to play. The Common Good Criteria 5 allows the Committee to support up to 50% of the total estimated costs if facilities are available to the general public. The Committee must also consider the annual financial assistance allocation (£16,000 in 2013/14). Auchterarder Common Good Fund Committee is asked to consider the request from Auchterarder Golf Club. Any work on the grounds will require consent from Auchterarder Common Fund.

#### Recommendation

2.8 Auchterarder Common Good Fund Committee is asked to consider the request from Auchterarder Golf Club.

3.1 The Committee is requested to approve the recommendations in the report.

Appendix 1 – Common Good Fund Criteria

### COMMON GOOD FUNDS WITHIN PERTH AND KINROSS AREA CRITERIA

Within the boundary of the relevant common good area and if funding is available, applications will be considered from individuals either in full time education or of senior citizen status and from groups whose members qualify on the same basis or which are operating within the same boundary.

- 1. Christmas lighting Firework displays up to a maximum of 50% of the total costs
- 2. Organisation of events/games/festivals up to a maximum of 50% of the total costs
- 3. Prizes at events/games/festivals
- 4. Acquisition of equipment consideration on merits up to a maximum of 50%
- 5. Capital grants for provision/improvement of facilities consideration on merits up to a maximum of 50% (the facilities must be available to the general public)
- 6. School/youth exchanges
- 7. School prizes
- 8. Voluntary work overseas
  - 6 months or more: £100 Perth Common Good Fund only: up to £400 per individual
  - 1 5 months: £100 Perth Common Good Fund only: up to £250 per individual
- 9. Attendance at summer schools/events
  - Less than 1 month but more than 2 weeks: £100 **Perth Common Good Fund only:** up to £150 per individual
  - One/two weeks: up to £100 per individual

10. Excursions/Parties (up to 2 per year per group)

Contribution of 50% towards the actual costs. Each organisation is allowed 2 applications during the course of a financial year. Perth Common Good Fund only: overall grant to be capped at up to £7 per individual with an overall maximum grant of up to £700.

- 11. Visits by and from School/Youth/Sport/Music groups
  - Contributions of up to £600 for groups less than 20 individuals and up to £1,000 for groups over 20 individuals for youth groups, senior citizen or vulnerable groups for activities exceeding 1 day. Perth Common Good Fund only and for schools: Contribution of 50% of the costs up to a maximum of £300 for each young person who due to financial difficulties are unable to participate in an extra curriculum school activity outwith the boundaries of Perth, exceeding 1 day and organised by a school. It will be the responsibility of each school to state the purpose of the extra curriculum school activity and identify such young person and advise the Common Good Fund accordingly.

## 12. <u>Any purpose where it can be demonstrated that there is a benefit to the community of the common good area</u>

The following is not eligible:

- Assistance with further or higher education fees
- Charity based sponsored walk/cycle/canoe etc.
- Town twinning activities other than those qualifying through the age/occupation criteria
- Organisations with religious/political associations where there are restrictions on usage or availability
- Core funding of the Voluntary sector
- Assistance with rental of premises
