## **Attendance, Attainment and Achievement**

### **Attendance**

Attending school and arriving on time are essential for pupil progress in learning and development.

Attendance is expressed as the average number of half days per pupil.

2020-21: 94.4%      2021-22: 91.3%      2022-23: 90.3%

### **Attainment**

Curriculum for Excellence (CFE) is used to plan, deliver and evaluate our curriculum for pupils from Nursery to P7. Teachers assess children's progress in a variety of ways and use information to plan next steps in learning.

Pupil progress is tracked through CFE Levels: Early Level spans Nursery and P1; P2 - P4 covers First Level and P5 - P7 Second Level.

### **The variety of data and evidence that we collect in Literacy and Numeracy indicates the following:**

In Primary 1, most pupils are on track to achieve early level in listening and talking, reading, writing and numeracy.

In Primary 4, all pupils are on track to achieve first level in listening and talking, most pupils are on track to achieve first level in reading and writing and almost all pupils are on track to achieve first level in numeracy.

In Primary 7, almost all pupils are on track to achieve second level in listening and talking and the majority of pupils are on track to achieve second level in reading, writing and numeracy.

This session we have continued to implement literacy, numeracy and health and wellbeing interventions using Pupil Equity Funding. Pupil Equity Funding has been used to provide additional support and opportunities for learners identified as having gaps in their learning or barriers to learning.

### **Attendance, Attainment and Achievement**

Development area 2022-2023:

*By June 2023, attainment in writing will increase by 5% at all stages from P1 – P7.*

Progress in this area was good.

- All staff are familiar with the PKC Raising Attainment in Writing Toolkit and the Refreshed Literacy Strategy.
- All staff participated in Explicitly Teaching Writing Training which has had a positive impact on learning, teaching and attainment in writing across the school.

*By June 2023, we will see a 5% improvement in literacy and communication with reference to the PKC ELC tracking.*

- 'Word Aware' and 'Teaching Children to Listen' were implemented successfully in the nursery setting.
- Floor Books are used effectively to initiate discussions with children about their learning.
- Regular visits to the library take place.
- Parents are actively involved in promoting literacy and language at home.

### **Learning**

Development area 2022-2023:

*By June 2023, all children in our school will have increased opportunities for effective learner participation.*

Progress in this area was good.

- An action plan is in place as we work towards RRSA Silver – Rights Aware.
- All classes implemented Class Charters and a RRS Steering Group was set up.
- Class reps have presented at assemblies and inform classes of the Right of the Month.

### **Leadership**

Development area 2022-2023:

*By June 2023, our school will have achieved the Digital School's Award.*

Progress in this area was good.

- All staff continue to develop their own digital skills and share good practice.
- Digital Leaders have presented at assemblies and set up a Lunch Time Coding Club.
- News/achievements is shared through Seesaw and the school app.
- A Digital Learning and Teaching Strategy is in place.
