Proposals for Straloch and Struan Primary Schools

Report by Director (Education and Children's Services)

PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report seeks approval from the Lifelong Learning Committee to review and update the Options Appraisals for Straloch Primary School and Struan Primary School regarding future proposals for both schools.

1. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

- 1.1 On 1 June 2011, the Lifelong Learning Committee approved the reports Statutory Consultation Straloch Primary School (Report 11/254 refers) and Statutory Consultation Struan Primary School (Report 11/255 refers). These reports sought approval to commence formal consultations on the proposals to close Straloch and Struan Primary Schools. It also sought approval of the Options Appraisals and Proposal Papers for both schools.
- 1.2 The Cabinet Secretary for Education and Lifelong Learning then announced the setting up of a Commission for the Delivery of Rural Education and requested a moratorium on rural school closures for one year. The moratorium was proposed to run from 20 June 2011 until 20 June 2012.
- 1.3 The Commission was tasked with, amongst other things:
 - To review the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010 and its application.
 - To examine how the delivery of rural education can maximise attainment and outcomes to give pupils the best life chances, and to examine, where appropriate, how this can be applied more widely.
 - To make recommendations on how to reflect best practice on the delivery of all aspects of education in rural areas (pre-school through to Higher and Further Education).
 - To examine the links between rural education and the preservation, support and development of rural communities and to make recommendations on how these links might be strengthened if necessary.
 - To examine and make recommendations on funding issues surrounding rural education.

- 1.4 Therefore, on 31 August 2011, Lifelong Learning Committee agreed that the decision to commence formal consultations on the proposals to close Straloch Primary School and Struan Primary School would be deferred until the outcome of the Commission on the Delivery of Rural Education was reported (Report 11/430 refers).
- 1.5 The Commission's work was due to be completed in August 2012 with a number of recommendations on the way forward for the delivery of education in rural areas. The Commission agreed in June 2012 that its report should be delayed to take into account a forthcoming Appeal in the Court of Session that was relevant to the operation of the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010. This was heard in November 2012, and a judgement received on 6 February 2013. This judgement provided a helpful opinion on the 2010 Act, a key part of the Commission's remit, and allowed the Commission to conclude its work and publish its report on 19 April 2013. The report made 38 recommendations relevant to the delivery of education in rural areas.
- 1.6 As a result of the recommendations made by the Commission, the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010 was amended by the Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014. Most of the amendments came into force on 1 August 2014. The final part of those amendments relating to the School Closure Review Panel were introduced and came into force on 30 March 2015.
- 1.7 The 2010 Act's principal purpose is to provide strong, accountable statutory consultation practices and procedures that local authorities must apply to their handling of all proposals for school closures and other major changes to schools. These consultation processes are expected to be robust, open, transparent and fair, and seen to be so. They are also expected to be consistent across Scotland.
- 1.8 The 2010 Act makes special arrangements in regard to rural schools, establishing in effect a presumption against the closure of rural schools. The result of this is that education authorities must consider a more detailed set of procedures and requirements in formulating a rural school closure proposal and in consulting on and reaching a decision as to whether to implement a rural school closure proposal.
- 1.9 The new duties are outlined in the <u>Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010</u> Statutory Guidance.
- 1.10 In addition, the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015 sets out a new right for community organisations to request the transfer of local assets into local community ownership/management. Public bodies including Councils must consider such requests and respond within a reasonable timescale to them.
- 1.11 The previously agreed arrangements to mothball Straloch Primary School and Struan Primary School from 15 August 2011 have continued during this period as all operational arrangements concerning pupils and staff were progressed and completed by July 2011 in preparation for both schools to be mothballed from 15 August 2011.

2. PROPOSALS

- 2.1 As the amendments to the legislation have now been concluded, it is proposed that Education and Children's Services now takes the opportunity to review the Options Appraisals which were undertaken in 2011 in respect of Straloch Primary School and Struan Primary School in accordance with the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010, as amended.
- 2.2 This will enable Education and Children's Services to determine whether the options identified in 2011 are still relevant for both schools and whether additional options require to be investigated further.

3. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 Following the amendments made to the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010, it is appropriate to review and update the Options Appraisals which were undertaken in 2011 in respect of Straloch Primary School and Struan Primary School which have both been mothballed since August 2011.
- 3.2 It is recommended that the Committee:
 - (i) Agrees that the Options Appraisals for Straloch Primary School and Struan Primary School are reviewed and updated; and
 - (ii) Instructs the Director (Education and Children's Services) to report back to the Committee on the findings and future proposals for Straloch Primary School and Struan Primary School in March 2016.
