RISK MANAGEMENT REGISTER

Report by Chief Officer

PURPOSE OF REPORT

The report updates the Board on the progress of developing a risk management strategy and the proposed initial risks.

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Integration Scheme for Perth and Kinross set out the requirement for the Parties and the Integration Joint Board to develop a Shared Risk Management strategy. The development of a shared strategy will consist of the identification, assessment and prioritization of risk related to the delivery of services, particularly those which are likely to affect the Integration Joint Board's delivery of the Strategic Plan; Identification and description of processes for mitigating these risks and agreed reporting standards.
- 1.2 Following a risk workshop on the 14th January for the health and social care partnership and a subsequent meeting on the 24th February an approach to developing a detailed risk register was agreed. Both workshops were facilitated by the respective Risk Managers of the partners. Further workshops are planned in March to develop the risks with identified risk managers. The managers with support from corporate and service risk staff will consider the risks identified in section 1.4 and Appendix 1 to determine the risks, owners, managers, controls and actions required. These risks will be reviewed alongside both partners risk registers to ensure consistency and reduce duplication of effort.

- 1.3 Following a risk workshop the senior officers identified the following main risks for the Partnership:
 - Financial resources
 - Governance unclear lines of accountability
 - Staff retention/Delayed Discharges
 - Information sharing

The risk register attached in Appendix 1 contains further detail for each risk and the owners, controls and actions to manage each of them.

2. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 It is recommended that the Board:
 - (a) Endorse the process proposed to develop the shared risk register with the two partner bodies;
 - (b) Note the high level risks identified in Appendix 1 to be further developed for the Board;
 - (c) Instructs the Chief Officer to report back to the Board at the next meeting with a comprehensive shared risk register.
