REVIEW OF CIVIC LICENCE FEES

Report by Head of Legal Services

PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report recommends that the Committee approves an increase fees shown in Appendix 1 for licences issued under the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.

1. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

- 1.1 The Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 gives the Council power to set fees for individual civic licenses in order to recover the cost of providing the civic licensing service. In setting the fees, the Council must ensure that the income received by the Council meets the expenses incurred in exercising its functions under the Act.
- 1.2 This review has been undertaken in accordance with the recommendations of the Scrutiny Committee report Charging for Services (report 15/65 refers) and the revised Corporate Charging Policy for full cost recovery of providing a service.
- 1.3 Additional fees require to be approved which are suplimentary to the previous report 16/63 considered by the Committee (Review of Civic Licensing Fees).

2. PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO FEES

- 2.1 It is proposed that the revised fees detailed in Appendix 1 attached to the report will be adopted with effect from 1 April 2016. These fees are subject to an inflationary increase of approximately 5.2%, in keeping with the Bank of England composite inflation index from 2012 to 2014. Fees are rounded up to the nearest £5.
- 2.2 Indicative costs for the Civic licensing function have been calculated. These costs have been based upon an estimate of the time spent on processing licences by relevant officers. It is projected that for the financial year 2015/16, the cost to the Council in exercising its functions under the Act will be £140,177 whilst income is forecast to be £129,013.
- 2.3 There is no prescribed statutory consultation process required to increase the licence fees under the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 as the legal requirement is to ensure that income is sufficient to cover expenditure and this is a question of fact. In setting fees however the Service has carried out some

benchmarking activity to ensure that charging proposals are fair and reasonable. It is proposed that a review of the fees be carried out annually to determine any impact that the fee increase may have on the number of licences and to ensure that the fees recovered continue to meet the cost of delivering the civic licensing function.

- 2.4 These proposals are consistent with the projected increase in the forecasted income of approximately £135,463 which allows a balanced budget.
- 2.5 These proposals would assist the Council in meeting the general duty imposed on it by the Equality Act 2010 to:-
 - (i) Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation
 - (ii) Advance equality of opportunity; and
 - (iii) Foster good relations

3. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION(S)

- 3.1 The report proposes an increase in fees charged in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 as set out in this report, to take effect from 1st April 2016.
- 3.2 The Committee is asked to note the contents of the report and approve the charges.
