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A Guide to Early Learning and Childcare (ELC) in Perth and Kinross

Early Learning and Childcare (ELC) is an important stage in a child's development and helps children to learn as they play. A good quality early learning and childcare experience builds on the valuable learning that takes place in and around the home, before children start primary school. It also develops the learning of other essential skills that they will rely on in later life.

There are currently 47 nursery classes based in primary schools and one stand-alone nursery provision which offer 16 hours of ELC per week across the school year (38 weeks). A number of full-time nursery places within local authority-managed nurseries are also available to eligible children on a Council-wide basis. All full-time nursery places are allocated on a Support for Children and Families basis and further information is available on page 10. ELC for eligible 2 year olds* is also available in a number of nurseries.

Perth & Kinross Council Education & Children's Services are working towards the expansion of Early Learning and Childcare (ELC) as outlined in the Scottish Government's Blueprint for 2020: The Expansion of Early Learning and Childcare in Scotland. By 2020, all 3-5 year olds and eligible 2 year olds will have access to 1140 hours of fully funded childcare, up to 30 hours per week, an increase of 540 hours per annum. The introduction of additional funded ELC is being rolled out on a phased basis across Perth and Kinross. This process is now underway and additional funded hours are available currently for those families meeting certain criteria.

Nursery classes in Inch View, Luncarty and St Dominic's primary schools offer additional childcare provision. Separate guidance on all aspects of childcare provision within Perth and Kinross is available from the Childcare & Family Information Service:

In addition to local authority managed nurseries, Education & Children's Services is currently in partnership with 36 partner provider centres which provide quality early learning and childcare within the private, voluntary and independent sector.

A full list of both local authority managed schools and classes, and partner provider centres is given at the end of this guidance.

This information is intended to help you and your child get the most out of the early learning and childcare experience by answering the most frequently asked questions we receive. Does my child need to start primary school this year?

Parents of children who are five on or between 1 March and the school commencement date in August 2019 have a duty to educate their child at primary school or make other arrangements for their education. Parents of children who will be five years old **between** the school commencement date in August and the last day of February can choose when their child begins primary school. Parents may send their children to primary school in August 2019 or delay entry to the following August. It is usually expected that children move on to primary school where their needs will be met through learning activities that suit them.

Parents of children who will be five years old between the start of the school session in August and the end of December who consider that their child may benefit from a further year of early learning and childcare should discuss this with the headteacher or partner provider manager. A referral for consideration for a funded deferred entry place can then be made. The Council's Priority Admissions Panel will make decisions on an individual basis.

Children who will be five years old between January and the last day of February are entitled to an additional year of funded early learning and childcare if their parents decide to delay their entry to primary school.

Further information on delayed or deferred entry is available from all schools.

Does my 3–5 year old child have to access an Early Learning and Childcare place?

No, it is for parents to decide whether they want their child to access early learning and childcare. However, it is thought that a quality experience of early learning and childcare can bring many benefits, including a smoother move into primary school as well as a better chance for success in learning.

My child has a nursery place, do I have to register again?

No, however If you wish to change your child's pattern of attendance at nursery for the new session a written request can be made by the date identified in '*Policy and Guidelines for Admission to Nursery Schools and Classes*'.

What Early Learning and Childcare is available?

Currently all 3 and 4 year olds and some eligible 2 year olds are entitled to 600 hours ELC per year. This equates to 16 hours per week across the school year (38 weeks).

This can be accessed through the following options:

- 2 full day sessions of 6 hours 24 minutes and 1 session of 3 hours 12 minutes.
- 1 full day session of 6 hours 24 minutes and 3 sessions of 3 hours 12 minutes (this could be 3 mornings, 3 afternoons or a mix of both).
- 5 sessions of 3 hours 12 minutes (this could be 5 mornings, 5 afternoons or a mix of both).
- Parents will continue to have the option of accessing two 3 hours 12 minutes sessions in the one day but would then be required to take their child home over the lunch time period.
- Please note that not all options are available in all schools. Please see page 15.
- Parents will have the option, if their child is staying for a full day session, of providing a packed lunch for their child or for their child to take a school lunch (this will be paid for by the parent unless there is qualification under free school meals criteria).

When is my 3–5 year old child eligible for an Early Learning and Childcare place?

All children aged 3-5 years old are eligible for 16 hours funded early learning and childcare per week 'in the term after their third birthday'. The following table shows the dates that children are entitled to apply for a pre-school education place in School Session 2019-2020:

Children born between:	Eligible to start nursery on:
1 March 2016 and 31 August 2016	Start of school session (August 2019)
1 September 2016 and 31 December 2016	Week commencing 6 January 2020
1 January 2017 and 28 February 2017	Week commencing 15 April 2020

Please note: children born on or between 1 September 2016 and 31 October 2016 may access a local authority nursery place week beginning 21 October 2019, provided staffing resources are available.

In addition to the above, parents of children who will be five years old between the school commencement date in August and the last day of February can choose whether to defer their child's start at primary school or apply for consideration for an additional year of early learning and childcare. Parents may send their children to primary school in August or delay entry to the following August. Further information on the options available to parents is outlined on page 6 of this guidance.

The cut-off date for eligible children accessing early learning and childcare in School Session 2019-2020 is **28 February 2020**. Children who will be three years old after this date will not be eligible for an early learning and childcare place until the start of the next school session (August 2020).

Can I apply to a private or independent nursery or playgroup for my 3–5 year old child's Early Learning and Childcare place?

Education & Children's Services is currently in partnership with 35 partner provider centres which provide quality early learning and childcare places for children aged 3-5 within the private, voluntary and independent sector. Contact details for partner provider centres are listed at the end of this guidance.

If you decide to take up your child's allocation of 600 hours early learning and childcare in a partner provider centre, the centre will advise you of the funding arrangements. Funding for the place is provided by the Scottish Government and is paid directly by the Council to the partner provider centre over 10 separate payments per year. The partner provider will explain this in more detail.

Perth & Kinross Council recognises that families have a variety of needs and preferences for accessing early learning and childcare. Parents, therefore, are entitled to apply for a place in more than one setting. The allocation of split funding places will be dependent on both settings being able to offer the hours requested. Children are entitled to a maximum of 16 hours of funded early learning and childcare each week across the school year (38 weeks). Application takes place directly at the school and/or partner provider centre. Some partner provider centres can offer additional hours for childcare purposes and you should talk to them directly about this.

Where and when do I apply for an Early Learning and Childcare place for my 3–5 year old child?

In early January of each year an advert is placed in the local press informing parents of the dates to apply for an early learning and childcare place within local authority managed schools and classes. Application for a place at these nurseries will take place in late January. Application forms are completed directly at the school. Your child's birth certificate and proof of child's address should be taken along when you apply.

Not all local authority-managed schools have a nursery class. Each nursery provision will have a defined '*locality*' - which may not be the same as the school catchment area. Nursery localities may be made up of one or more individual school catchment areas. A full list of local authority managed nurseries and partner provider centres appears at the end of this guidance. The list also shows what these localities are. **A place in a nursery class does not give children priority in gaining a place in the same school when enrolling for Primary 1.**

Partner provider centres will establish their own application process as well as priority categories and details can be obtained by contacting the individual centres.

Dates for registration at partner provider centres may vary and it is advisable to check with the individual centre for details of their registration dates.

Can I apply to more than one centre for my 3–5 year old child's Early Learning and Childcare place?

Parents are asked to indicate on their application form whether they wish to take up their child's entitlement as a split funded place, eg some sessions within Council nurseries and some commissioned within partner provider nurseries. This often helps to meet the needs of parents who work part-time as they may purchase additional hours of care within partner provider nurseries to support their working needs.

If a parent is seeking a split funded place, they will be required to complete an application form for each establishment they are seeking a place within.

Parents should be made aware that although every effort will be made to meet their needs, there is no guarantee that it will be possible to offer split funded

places in every case. The allocation of a split funded place will be dependent upon both of the establishments being able to offer the hours requested.

A letter will be sent out from the school advising parents that a place has been allocated for their child. Parents should then inform all other nurseries to which they have applied if they do not wish to take up an allocated place.

In May/June parents and children will be invited along to the nursery to enrol. This will give parents the opportunity to discuss any concerns with the nursery staff.

Places within partner provider centres are allocated in accordance with the centre's Admissions Policy and a copy can be obtained from the individual centre.

How are Early Learning and Childcare places allocated for 3–5 year olds?

Places at local authority managed nurseries are allocated on a priority basis relating to the age of the child and place of residence.

Places within partner provider centres are allocated in accordance with the centre's Admissions Policy, a copy of which can be obtained from the individual centre.

Are there any full-time places available for 3–5 year olds?

Yes, a number of full-time places are allocated under Support for Children and Families' criteria on a Council-wide basis.

Referrals for these places should be made to the Council on the basis of educational or social need by headteachers and/or other relevant agencies. *(Please see 'Policy and Guidelines for Admission to Nursery Schools and Classes' for further information).* Additional funded ELC (1140 hours) will be available in some settings for those families meeting eligibility criteria.

Does my 3–5 year old child need to be toilet trained before he/she can start nursery?

No, this is not a requirement but it would help staff greatly if your child was toilet trained. As initial registration is in January and enrolment in May/June, your child may not be toilet trained at this time. However, it is quite possible that by the

start of the school session in August they will be, so do not worry about this at registration or enrolment. If the situation is that your child is not yet fully toilet trained please do discuss this with the staff at your chosen nursery who will deal with this sensitively. Nurseries will be equipped for changing children and toileting procedures including changing will be shared with parents.

What is a Strong Start 2 place?

Early Learning and Childcare places are now available for children who are 2 years of age. These places will be offered to eligible children in line with criteria set down by the Scottish Government.

What Strong Start 2 places are available?

Strong Start 2 places are 600 hours of free Early Learning and Childcare which will be delivered in line with the arrangements for children aged 3-5 years.

Can I apply for a Strong Start 2 place for my 2 year old child?

If as a parent you are receiving any of the following benefits, then your child may be eligible for a place*:

- *Income Support (IS).*
- *Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance (IBJA).*
- *Any income-related element of Employment and Support Allowance.*
- *Child Tax Credit (CTC), but not Working Tax Credit, and your income is less than £16,105.*
- *Child Tax Credit (CTC) and Working Tax Credit (WTC) and your income is less than £6,420.*
- *You may also be eligible if you are an asylum seeker receiving support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.*
- *Universal Credit where the monthly earned income does not exceed £610.*
- *Incapacity Benefit or Severe Disablement Allowance.*
- *State Pension Credit.*

Please note: *Figures correct at time of going to print.*

* *Your 2 year old child may also be eligible under Looked After Children criteria and advice is available from your allocated Social Worker.*

When can my 2 year old child begin nursery?

There are 3 entry dates across the year. Your 2 year old child will become eligible for a place in the term either following their 2nd birthday, or in the term after you begin to receive the qualifying benefit(s).

Term:	Children born between:
Term 1 August - December 2019	1 March 2017 and 31 August 2017
Term 2 January - March 2020	1 September 2017 and 31 December 2017
Term 3 April - July 2020	1 January 2018 and 28 February 2018

***Please note:** children who become 2 years old between 1 September and 31 October 2019 may access a place during week commencing 22 October 2019 provided no additional staffing resources are required.*

How do I apply?

Application forms are available from any Perth & Kinross Council nursery with 2 year old provision (as below) or can be downloaded from the internet at **www.pkc.gov.uk**

These should be fully completed and should be handed in to the nursery you wish to apply to along with the following:

- *evidence of the qualifying benefits you receive;*
- *proof of your child's age (birth certificate); and*
- *proof of parent's residency at the time of application. This must be Council Tax documentation.*

***Please note:** it may not be possible to offer your child a place in the nursery of your first choice.*

You may have more questions or concerns about your 2 year old attending nursery. Please be assured that staff are fully qualified and experienced in working with young children and are very sensitive to their individual needs. Staff will work closely with families to ensure your child's experiences at nursery are nurturing and supportive of their learning and development.

Can my child access Early Learning and Childcare in another authority?

Perth & Kinross Council has funding arrangements with other Councils. This means that parents may send their children to early learning and childcare centres outside Perth and Kinross and still qualify for a funded early learning and childcare place.

You will need to check with the relevant local authority regarding the availability of places and funding arrangements.

How do I find out more about Early Learning and Childcare for my child?

A full list of local authority managed nurseries and partner provider centres appears at the end of this guidance. The headteacher of each nursery school and class will be happy to discuss any matters in relation to their own nursery with you.

All providers of government funded early learning and childcare for 3-5 year olds are currently inspected by Social Care and Social Work Improvement Scotland (known as the Care Inspectorate), and Education Scotland. The staff follow national guidelines for the education of children aged 3-5 years that encourage learning through play and the service must meet standards laid down by Education Scotland.

What is the criteria for additional funded ELC (1 140 hours) eligibility?

At present the additional funded hours are being offered on a phased basis to those families meeting criteria. By August 2020 the hours will be available to all families.

Eligibility Criteria is as follows:

- *Children will be eligible for 1140 hours of flexible free childcare if they currently receive a Support for Children and Families place or if the family receive any of the following benefits:*

Income Support • Jobseeker's Allowance (Income Based) • Employment Support Allowance (Income Based) • Child Tax Credit, but not Working Tax Credit, and your income is less than £16,105 • Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit and your income is less than £6,420* • Universal Credit where the monthly earned income does not exceed £610 • Asylum Seeker receiving support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 • Incapacity Benefit or Severe Disablement Allowance • State Pension Credit.*

** The income threshold for CTC & WTC can vary annually.*

A child may also be eligible from the point they are looked after, under a kinship care order, or with a parent-appointed guardian.

Please note that 1140 hours is also available in some rural locations and eligibility is based on the child's home postcode. Please see www.pkc.gov.uk for more detail.
