Access is by way of a straight path leading directly into our premises via the front door. All floors are finished in a commercial grade LVT (Luxury Vinyl Tile) wood effect floor covering with no ramps, humps or bumps to impede wheelchair access.

Due to the nature and finish of the decorative flooring, movement is simple and easy requiring little effort for traction movement.

Question 3

Facilities available

Please describe in detail the facilities provided for disabled people. e.g. disabled toilets, lifts, accessible tables.

We have a disabled toilet , again with simple and easy access due to the nature of the flooring with no unobtrusive objects, humps or bumps to impede access.

Within the disabled toilet there is enough space for a wheelchair to rotate 360 degrees freely without obstructions. There are also drop down hand rails and fixed rails for extra support, a raised toilet as well as the sink positioned in a way that is easily reachable without the need to stand and leave the toilet for the sake of washing hands.

Other provisions

Please provide details of any other provisions made to aid the use of the premises by disabled people. e.g. assistance dogs welcome, large print menus.

Dogs for the Blind, working dogs as well as support dogs are welcomed on arrival.

Working dogs or support Dogs do require some sort of evidence to support their purpose on arrival for example a simple dog harness labelled as “working dog” or “blind dog in training” would suffice.
