For a permit on (*Date*) _____ 2024 to angle with rod and line in the fishings belonging to the Council for salmon and fish of the salmon kind and other species including coarse fish, subject to the conditions specified.

Conditions

1. The permit shall be valid only on the day for which it is issued.
2. The holder shall fish according to Salmon and Freshwater Fisheries (Consolidation) (Scotland) Act 2003.
3. The permit is not transferable nor valid if unsigned by the holder.
4. Day permit holders are not entitled to fish from Moncrieffe Island.
5. The permit must be carried by the holder when fishing in the Council's fishings and produced on demand to all persons entitled to ask for such production.
6. Fishing from bridges over the river is prohibited.
7. Fishing is prohibited over the stretch from the Railway Bridge southwards to the former Burgh Boundary from one hour after sunset to sunrise.
8. No person shall fish for more than 10 minutes at any one stance if any other person is waiting.
9. No person convicted of an offence whether statutory or otherwise related directly or indirectly to fishing or the possession of illegally taken fish shall be entitled to a permit for a period of five years following the seizure of a permit or conviction.
10. All salmon to be returned from 15 January to 31 March. 1 April to 15 October: anglers are restricted to catching 1 salmon per person per day as per Tay River System Rules.
11. It is illegal to use natural prawns and shrimps (whether fresh or preserved dyed, or natural colour) and any part thereof shall not be used as a bait to fish or take salmon.

- (a) This application should be submitted in advance to the Executive Director (Communities), Communities, Perth & Kinross Council, Pullar House, 35 Kinnoull Street, PERTH, PH1 5GD, together with the administration charge for the permit.

- (c) **Contravention of any of the above conditions will mean the immediate forfeiture of the permit and the holder may not be entitled to a permit at any time in the future.**

Danger

When fishing, particularly with carbon fibre rods, beware of any overhead cables.

The information provided by you will be used by Perth & Kinross Council in the administration of the Council's Fishings on the River Tay. The information may be shared with Police Scotland in order to ensure fishing is carried out in accordance with the law, and with the Scottish Government in terms of the annual catch returns we are required to submit.
