


- 6-weekly
- NQSWs join the community as they take up employment and remain for 12/18 months depending on whether they are FT or PT
- Practice themed sessions led by NQSW Lead and experienced practitioners on practice themes relating to CPL requirements and PKCs essential learning requirements
- Supporting NQSWs across HSCP, Children, Families and Justice and third sector, as requested
- Broadening understanding of the Social Work role through integrated learning across services, mirroring the PKC approach to Student Peer Learning
- Linked to TEAMS channel sharing information on learning opportunities, answering FAQs and sharing achievements!
