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Your CPL - spotlight on trauma informed practice

As part of your continuous professional learning (CPL) you need to learn about trauma informed practice.

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Consultation on the revised Fitness to Practise Rules

SSSC are proposing changes to the Fitness to Practise Rules (FTP Rules) that set out what we do when we receive a concern about a social service worker.

These updates aim to improve how we handle cases involving vulnerable witnesses, Temporary Orders, workers with health issues and how we review decisions.

The consultation is open from **3 November 2025 to 26 January 2026** and we want to hear from:

- social service workers
- · employers and learning providers
- people who use care services or care for someone who does
- trade unions, lawyers and advice centres.
